
help you to refer to and apply that information more quickly and more effectively.

RIGHT-SIDE ACTIVITIES

- Take notes from class

Movie

<u>Thor</u> —> Reference to Norse mythology (Norse —> Vikings/Scandinavian = Sweden, Finland, Norway, Denmark); accurate representation of Thor/Loki relationship but Loki's characterization is more villainous.

SHARE... LITERATURE

Romeo & Juliet Storyline/plot relates/parallels "Pyramus & Thisbe" (forbidden love, try to make it work, run away, misunderstood death/suicide — tragedy!)

<u>Percy Jackson</u> modernized, reimagined, adaptation of Greek mythology; Percy —> Perseus

SHARE... COMIC

MYth - Graphic Novel - Artist takes myths and reinterprets/reinvents the stories with a very personal touch (Zelda C. Wang)



Vocabulary

iconography: the visual images and symbols used in a work of art or the study or interpretation of these.


iconology: the study of visual imagery and its symbolism and interpretation, esp. in social or political terms.

Greek Root Word = eikon "likeness"

BEFORE WE DISCUSS


When writing, consider the associations we can make between the images in the context or lens of this class. Focus on the way the subject is represented.
